

# Except and except for

Both except and except for can be used after words like all, every, no, everything, anybody, nowhere, whole etc. In other cases, we use except for.

All the invitees turned up except Shyam. OR All the invitees turned up except for Shyam.  
Both except and except for are possible after all.

Except for Shyam all the invitees turned up. (NOT Except Shyam all the invitees turned up.)
