Each positive sentence given below is followed by two forms of its negative. Put a tick mark against the correct form and say why the other one is wrong.

1. We had a meeting of the union leaders yesterday.

2. I have a bath before dinner every day.

a) Susie hasn't returned from her trip to Africa.

b) Susie didn't return from her trip to Africa.
