Either could be used here

After modal auxiliary verbs, the infinitive is used without to.

2. How dare you me a stupid?

call

to call

Either could be used here

When dare is used as a modal auxiliary verb, it is followed by an infinitive without to.

3. Need I any longer?

wait

to wait

Either could be used here

When need is used as a modal auxiliary verb, it is followed by an infinitive without to.

4. You had better her what she wants.

give

to give

Either could be used here

The infinitive is used without to after had better.

5. My mother does not let me up late.

stay

to stay

Either could be used here

Let is followed by object + infinitive without to.

6. They made him the place.

leave

to leave

Either could be used here

Make is followed by object + infinitive without to.

7. I saw him in.

come

to come

Either could be used here

See is followed by object + infinitive without to.

8. She was heard that she was disappointed.

say

to say

Either could be used here

In passive structures with hear, the infinitive is used with to.

9. I was made

apologize

to apologize

Either could be used here

In passive structures with make, the infinitive is used with to.

10. We heard him that he was quitting.

say

to say

Either could be used here

Hear is followed by object + infinitive without to.

11. Did you feel the earth

move

to move

Either could be used here

Feel is followed by object + infinitive without to.

12. The doctor advised me smoking.

quit

to quit

Either could be used here

Advise is followed by object + infinitive with to.
