Save up

To save up money is to accumulate it.

I am saving up money to buy a new laptop.

See about

To see about something is to consider it or arrange it.

I am going to see about buying a new apartment.

See off

To see off someone is to say good-bye to them.

I am going to see off my sister at the airport.

See to

To see to something is to ensure that it happens.

I will see to it that he gets his due.

See through

To see through something is to finish it despite difficulties.

Now that I have a young baby I am not able to see through my studies.

Set up

To set up a relationship is to arrange it.

He set his daughter up with his friend's son.

Set up

To set up somebody is to incriminate them falsely.

I don't think that he took the money. Somebody set him up.

To set up an appointment or meeting is to arrange it.

I have set up an appointment with the minister at 4.30 this afternoon.

Show off

To show off something is to show it to everyone with a lot of pride.

He likes to show off his cars.

Show off

To show off is to boast or draw attention to oneself.

Young boys show off to impress girls.
